


Day Services

Thornage Hall offers a range of Day Services in traditional arts and craft and land based activities. We assess everyone on their skill development and run the workshops like a work place to help people progress.







What we do

Thornage Hall provides supported living accommodation in 5 houses located in the beautiful surroundings of the Thornage Hall estate in North Norfolk.

We run a biodynamic farm which provides food for those living in our houses, as well as sales to local organic outlets. We have built on the success of the farm and converted farm buildings into studios for our Day Services offering a range of craft, IT and artistic activity – greatly enriching the lives of those people with learning disabilities who have a thirst to develop new skills within a working environment.

Community based support

Camphill Communities were inspired by the work of Rudolf Steiner and Karl Konig. They were based on an ethos that recognises the uniqueness of all individuals and seeks to respect, value and enhance the strengths and potential of everyone.



Today we continue to provide support as part of a community. Through the community individuals are supported to develop their own unique strengths in order to reach their potential. At the same time, in order to thrive our community relies on the uniqueness of all the individuals within it.

The high quality care and support that is both given and received, makes Thornage a very special place for all who come here.



Supported Living



We believe that everyone has the right to choose how they live their life. We work closely with Freebridge Housing to provide a high standard of accommodation. Tenants live together supported by our staff to live the life they choose as independently as possible.
